Dangerous driving

I am rather saddened to report that following our request in the

newsletter last week for courteous and careful driving at the busiest times of the school day, there has unfortunately been reports of parents not adhering to road safety at drop off and pick up times. One incident involves a large pick-up truck which is parking outside the school entrance in the zig-zag yellow areas, this is a no parking zone and also illegal. Having collected their child/children the parent has by this time delayed the buses from leaving the premises but also and more dangerously, proceeded to reverse without 'sufficient care' before driving off. Several parents and children have seen this occur and have had to move out of the way quickly as they were concerned for their safety! This kind of driving and parking is completely inappropriate, unnecessary and dangerous. We all need to be more careful and more thoughtful around the school site please. No parking areas and zones are there for a reason and no one is above the law when it comes to child safety. I cannot emphasise enough the need for consideration and care towards each other and our neighbours along the school and in the wider area. Thank you.
