

Stokenham have always done extremely well at this event raising £1000's of pounds towards the various nominated charities and for Stokenham School. This year we would like to enter 8 teams from year groups 4 through to 6 for the Annual Swimarathon. The event takes place during the afternoon on Friday 13th October. Each team takes it in turns to swim as many lengths as possible in 55 minutes and your child MUST be able to swim a length of the Quayside pool. Around the School this Week

After sharing the book All Kinds of People and discussing diversity and difference, the Reception children looked in mirrors and described their facial features. They then mixed and used paints to carefully create these super self-portraits.



This week in Maths, Year 2 have been counting in tens' and ones and looking at the value of each digit in a two-digit number. They have been using their knowledge of unitising and subitising to count tens and ones and recording this in different ways. They used a variety of practical manipulatives to help them group their tens and ones.







In year 3 we have been exploring charcoal in Art and have created large drawings using a range of techniques. We will eventually be creating our own dramatic artwork by drawing with charcoal by torchlight. In French, we have learnt to say our names and ask somebody else theirs. We are enjoying learning a new language and had great fun singing a song in French.





This week, Year 4 have been creating electrical circuits using wires, a bulb and a cell, and learning about the scientific vocabulary we use when talking about electricity.
