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Dear Parents and Carers.

Bake Sale for Harvest Festival - please can you help?



The PTFA are organising a Bake Sale for Harvest Festival. If you have a child in Reception or Year 1 please could you bring to the church on Friday 6th a cake, a small plate of cakes or some cookies or biscuits for the PTFA to serve with tea/coffee after the Harvest Festival performance.

The trip is set up on Parent Pay, please complete the necessary consent form, questions, payment and ordering of a packed lunch from the school kitchen if you need one. The children will travel to Plymouth by Tally Ho! coach leaving school mid-morning and returning at approximately 5.30pm.











Year 6 Civic Award

Letters have gone out today about the Torbay and Devon Civic Award. The Civic Award does a great deal to develop children's character. It encourages them to be compassionate and to take responsibility for positive change. It also supports them in leading purposeful and full lives and is great preparation for both secondary school and the workplace. Children who take part in the Torbay and Devon Civic Award report that it helps them learn skills of working both collaboratively and independently, skills of managing and organising events and makes them feel 'grown up'. It certainly builds self-esteem and confidence. We hope that this year our Year 6 children will participate fully.

To achieve the award, pupils have to demonstrate their participation in five main areas. These are:

- Active Citizenship in their school community. This could be Team Captains, Eco -council
 members, Reading Buddies, School Council members or other positions of trust and
 responsibility in school.
- Active Citizenship in their home communities. Pupils can take part in beach cleans, bulb
 planting, helping at Brownies/Cubs/sports clubs and looking after people in their
 community. Pupils may also work with others to organise events in school to support local
 charities.
- A physical hobby(ies) and a non-physical hobby(ies). Pupils should spend an average of 30 minutes a week on each of their hobbies. One of them needs to be new to the child from the September of their Year 6 year.
- Residential experience and adventure training. This entails sleeping away from home and taking part in outdoor challenges, stretching themselves and showing a willingness to learn new skills.
- Children also need to adopt a cause or charity which they feel strongly about. They need
 to research it carefully and find ways of demonstrating their support for it.

For those candidates who take part and pass the assessment, an award ceremony will take place next Summer with awards and certificates will be given out. Our Year 6 are already very excited and thinking about events they could organise for this. We wish them lots of luck in undertaking this fabulous challenge - they will do us proud!

Swimarathon - Friday 13th October

Stokenham have always done extremely well at this event raising £1000's of pounds towards the various nominated charities and for Stokenham School. This year we would like to enter 8 teams from year groups 4 through to 6 for the Annual Swimarathon.



If your child would like to take part full details about the event are now on Parent Pay.

- The event will take place during the school day on <u>Friday 13th October</u>.
- Each team will take it in turns to swim as many lengths as possible in 55 minutes.
- Your child MUST be able to swim a full length of the Quayside pool.
- Please confirm your child's attendance via the Parent Pay system as soon as possible so we can sort out teams. Thank you.

Christmas Cards!

Please remember to return your child's Christmas card design to school by <u>next Monday</u>, <u>October 2nd</u>. Please note that the design must be portrait and not landscape! If you miss the deadline then the card will not be printed! We look forward to seeing all the lovely Christmas-inspired designs.

Data Collection Information

The deadline has now passed but we are still short of some of your data collection sheets! **ALL** data sheets need to be returned. It is vitally important that this information is up to date for every child in school and particularly with regard to any contact details or medical information the school needs to be aware of. Medicines in School

A reminder that at school we are not permitted to administer medications of any kind to children without you as the parent or carer completing, signing and handing in a 'green form' to the office. We can only administer medicines that have been prescribed by a doctor. We do not keep medicines of any kind at school and children must not be sent to school with any kind of medicine from home to take during the day. If you are in any doubt please contact the office.

Pupil Premium

If, due to your financial situation, your child has Free School Meals (not to be confused with Universal Free Schools Meals for those children in Reception and Years 1 and 2) your child will qualify for Pupil Premium and you will be allocated £100 to spend in school on specific items. See examples below. Each time you would like the school to use your child's allocation you can let us know and we will deduct it from their Pupil Premium account.

School Trips & Residentials

Each time information is sent you can request a contribution towards a trip by letting the school office know.

School Uniform

With your funding you can buy our logoed school uniform and book bags, please speak to Mrs Lewis who will be able to organise this for you.

After School Clubs at School

Some After School Clubs are run at school by external providers and for these activities you may use your funding towards part or full payment.

Music Lessons

A number of music teachers come into our school to deliver private music lessons. Again, please contact the provider in the first instance to see whether they have availability and to organise a block of lessons and they can invoice school directly.

What if my circumstances change?

Don't worry, we will not ask you to refund the £100 even if your circumstances change. We will only ask for a refund if you spend over the £100. If you need to find out the balance on your child's Pupil Premium Fund please contact the school office. Please note, however, that if you have an unspent balance at the end of the year (cut off 1^{st} March 2024) it does not carry forward into the next Financial Year.

If you feel that your child may be entitled to Free School Meals, please see Mrs Lewis in the office who will be able to help you. All enquiries will be in strictest confidence.

Around the School this Week
