In-House Tag Rugby Festival







On Wednesday afternoon our Year 5 and 6 children competed in our first in-house tag rugby tournament. There was a buzz of excitement on the school field as the Gara Greens, Lannacombe Lemons, Beesands Blues and Slapton Scarlets warmed up and discussed tactics. With two pitches set up we were able to play 2 matches simultaneously, ensuring that all children were playing at all times. We had 3 closely contested rounds, each team pitting their wits against each other. After much adding up, the results were in: Beesands Blues and Lannacombe Lemons tied in joint third with 7 points each and Gara Greens and Slapton Scarlets were our eventual winners, tying for first place with 11 points each. Congratulations to our winners and a tremendous "Well done" to all of the children who participated - they had an amazing time and left school tired, muddy and in high spirits. Thank you very much to Mr Freeborn and Mr Taylor for refereeing, your help was much appreciated and we couldn't have run the tournament without you. We are looking forward to next Wednesday 31st January, when it is the turn of our Year 3s and Year 4s. In Year 6 this week we have been busy conducting an investigation about light. The class were exploring what happens to the shadow when there is a change in the distance of the light source from the object. The children worked in small groups to measure the size of the shadows. Next stop, they will be plotting their results into a graph.

News from the Kitchen

This week saw the beginning of our Food Matters campaign. We are teaching the children about food waste, the environmental impact of wasting food and it also allows the kitchen to see where areas of concern are. Each class has a 'bucket' to put their waste food in and at the end of lunch each bowl is weighed. At the end of the week the class with the least waste per child is awarded a trophy. The campaign will last 9 weeks and there will be a grand prize at the end.

Whilst we are encouraging the children to think about what they are wasting, we DON'T want any children going hungry because of the competition. Children have been told that if they are not sure they may like an item of food, they are to ask for a small portion and if they want more they can come and ask.

We hope you can join us with this important campaign by discussing food waste at home. When making menu choices, please discuss with your children to make sure they are choosing options that they like. By pre-booking their meals this ensures all children get to eat what they like and will in turn reduce waste and our school carbon footprint.
