### Artist of the Week - Vincent Van Gogh

Our Year 5 Arts Council Casey and Holly told us today all about the Artist of the week - Vincent Van Gogh. A Dutch artist who became more famous after he died - one reason being, he chopped his ear off! He was only 37 years old. One of his famous paintings 'The Starry Night' would cost a large fortune, between £70 million to £100 million. He painted over 900 pieces of artwork over 10 years, approximately 1 painting every 3 to 4 days.
