Google Classrooms

Google Classrooms is a fantastic tool used in school by the children to access many forms of learning. It is also a great platform for us to use to involve you as parents in your child's learning journey. Each child has an individual Google Classrooms account and there is a user name and password for each

one. The teachers are going to use Google Classrooms more and more as a vehicle to share important information with you. This will include homework, spellings, reminders and arrangements. It is really important therefore that you are familiar with the user name and password for your child. The teachers will be sending these out to you individually via book bags. Please make sure you look out for the details that you need to sign in and keep up to date!

Year 6 Exeter Cathedral Trip

Firstly, they looked around St Martins church and had to find similarities and differences between the church and then the cathedral. World Book Day - Thursday 7th March




