





Albert: "I wanted the Polar Bear Explorers Club and the Bunny vs Monkey so I'm excited to read them."


Holly: "I was excited to get Cat Kid because they are so funny and I love them." James: "I've wanted Investigators for 2 years. I've already started reading it."
